Dear Rick:

With less than one month until the election, here at the Michigan League of Conservation Voters, we are still getting a number of questions regarding the positions you hold on key conservation issues. Unfortunately, on a handful of these important questions, we are unable to give voters the information on your positions they are looking for as we are still not exactly sure ourselves. In order to guarantee that Michigan taxpayers are able to walk into the voting booth fully informed on the conservation concerns that will shape our state's future, we have drawn up our Final Eight Questions that we hope you will answer.

These questions cover a range of environmental policies that impact citizens from their parks to their paychecks. We have pulled these questions from our gubernatorial comparison chart – “Charting the Governor’s Race” – and cross-referenced them with our ongoing Candidate Tracker to remove any points you have already clarified on the campaign trail. We are submitting the same set of questions to Virg Bernero, as well.

Our hope is that you will have the opportunity to answer these questions at your earliest convenience, which we may then share with all Michiganders. Of course, as we are eager to have these points addressed, we will also be distributing these questions to our members and allies who will be attending public events where you will be accepting questions from the audience. One way or the other, we look forward to learning your thoughts on these vital points of interest.

The Final Eight Questions touch upon the following issues and are enclosed, in their entirety, within this letter: The Renewable Portfolio Standard, a moratorium on coal plants, wind power, comprehensive water protection, the MDNRE budget, funding for State Parks, Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs), and sulfide mining.

As you are well aware, we endorsed you in the Republican primary due to your focus on the environment and green job innovation in Michigan. We approach you again now, in the same good faith, to ask for your response to these remaining questions for Michigan voters.

Thank you again for your attention on these issues and we look forward to hearing back from you at your earliest convenience.
